

### **Stated Meeting of the Session 2016**

From the Session:

At the Stated Meeting held on July 17, 2016, with Rev. Grant Gillard serving as Moderator, the Session:

- 1. Approved requests from six members to be removed from the church rolls
- 2. Heard a report that the sale of the Activities Building was finalized on June 26, 2016.
- 3. Tentatively approved a recommendation From the Finance Committee regarding the investment and use of the proceeds from the Activities Building sale. Final approval will be considered at the August Session Meeting.
- 4. Approved removal from the church rolls, 16 names of persons who have not participated in or supported the church for several years. (This action is in accordance with the PC(U.S.A.) Book of order, and takes the total church membership to 149 members.
- 5. Called a Congregational Meeting to be held on August 7th at the end of the worship service for the purpose of nominating, electing, ordaining and installing an elder to fill an unexpired term on the Session.
- 6. Formulated plans to have an open discussion gathering of the members and friends of the church, to hear and share concerns, suggestions, etc. regarding the future of the church. This unofficial congregational meeting will be facilitated by Rev. Terry Epling, and will be held at 12:30 p.m. on August 7th beginning with a luncheon.

It was a long, but very efficient and productive, meeting of the Session.



**The Session is calling a Special Meeting of the Congregation** to be held at the end of the Worship Service on Sunday, August 7, 2016. The purpose of the meeting will be for the Nominating Committee to present Ray Wilhelm to fill an unexpired term on the Session. Following an election for this position there will be a service of Ordination/Installation. Rev. Grant Gillard will officiate at this meeting.

**Ray Wilhelm** is being nominated for Elder by the Nominating Committee. He is to fill a vacancy in the Class of 2017 on the Session. Ray and his wife Sandy joined our church in 2001on transfer of letter from Westminster Presbyterian Church in Cape. He has served a term as Deacon, has been a member of the Fellowship Committee and ushers frequently.

# The Rev. Sam Roethemeyer will be in the pulpit August 7, 14, & 28<sup>th</sup>.

He grew up in Nashville, Illinois and. graduated from Greenville College, Greenville Illinois after high school, with Bachelors degree in Religion and Philosophy in 1972. He and his wife were married on May 27, 1972 in her hometown, Okawville, Illinois. Rev. Sam attended Eden Theological Seminary in 1975 with a Master's Degree and was ordained in St. Paul United Church of Christ in Nashville, June 8, 1975. He served as Pastor in Olney/Dundas, Illinois First and Saron United Church of Christ from 1975 to 1979, St. John United Church of Christ, Trenton, Illinois 1979-1988, and finally at Emanuel United Church of Christ from 1988 until September 20, 2014 when he retired. They live in Jackson and he continues to be President of the Jackson Ministerial Alliance, volunteering a lot of time to its food pantry. They have three Children, Christy Shinn (Geoff), Beth St. John(Jason), and Matthew Roethemeyer (Diana), and seven Grandchildren.
