■ Music Notes

February is Black History Month. It was chosen to honor the birthdays of President Abraham Lincoln (Feb. 12, 1809-April 15, 1865) and Frederick Douglass (Feb. 14, 1818-Feb. 20, 1895). Throughout this month the music will feature many selections in honor of Black History.

Jesus Loves Me was written in 1860 and is now sung all over the world. No less than the noted theologian, Karl Barth, quoted this simple song when asked to summarize his faith and theology. The text was written by Anna B. Warner (1827-1915) and her sister, Susan Warner (1819-1885). They lived in New York near West Point and taught Sunday School for the cadets. Hymn researcher Kenneth Osbeck says that the text was from a best-selling novel spoken by one of the characters as he comforted a dying child. William B. Bradbury (1816-1868), an East Coast organist, choir director, and composer of the tune, added the "Sunday School form" refrain. Other Bradbury hymns in our hymnal include: "Just As I Am", "My Hope is Built on Nothing Less", and "Savior Like a Shepherd Lead Us". He also wrote "He Leadeth Me" and "Sweet Hour of Prayer."

The term **Doxology** is derived from the Greek and is usually identified with a short hymn of praise, often to the Triune God. It has its origins from a similar worship practice in the Jewish synagogues. These songs of praise, actually small statements of faith, were frequently added to the last verse of a hymn, psalm or prayer. Today we are using a Doxology to the tune of "Amazing Grace."

O Lord, Hear My Prayer (#471) is from the ecumenical community of Taizé, located in the Burgundy region of France. Both Protestant and Roman Catholic Christians from many nations gather there each week for prayer and meditation. Last fall we sang "In the Lord I'll Be Ever Thankful" (#654), another chant from Taizé. Several of their musical prayers are in our hymnal including "Jesus, Remember Me" (#227), written in 1981 for the World Council of Churches. Guide Me O Thou Great Jehovah was written by William Williams (1717-1791), a Welsh Anglican clergyman who had left a medical profession to pursue a career in ministry. It first appeared in a hymnal in 1745. The original stanzas were translated into English in 1771 by Peter Williams (no relation). The tune, "Cwm Rhondda," also used in another beloved Presbyterian hymn, "God of Grace and God of Glory," was composed in 1907 by the Welshman, John Hughes (1873-1932). The tune name refers to a "low valley" surrounding the district of Rhondda in southern Wales. Some interesting tidbits about the hymn from www.cyberhymnal.org: *The hymn, sung in Welsh, was in the Academy Award winning movie "How Green Was My Valley" (1941). Sung in English it was used at the funeral of Diana, Princess of Wales, in Westminster Abbey, London (1997).* Kenneth Osbeck's book, "101 Hymn Stories," says that this hymn has been translated into over 75 languages, and "it is not uncommon even today for a large crowd at some public event such as a rugby match (in Wales) to burst into the spontaneous singing of this hymn."

May you be inspired to meditate on the music and texts.
