They live in Jackson and he continues to be President of the Jackson Ministerial Alliance, volunteering a lot of time to its food pantry. They have three Children, Christy Shinn (Geoff), Beth St. John (Jason), and Matthew Roethemeyer (Diana), and seven Grandchildren.
