

Looking Back and Looking Forward





In the life of the church the next major event is our annual congregational meeting on February 12th. We will review the previous year and look to the future. You accomplished a lot in 2016 that set the course for the way ahead. There are parts of 2016 that you'd probably rather not remember but rehearsing the past offers opportunities for celebration, reflection, repentance, and forgiveness. All of that is necessary as we set our eyes toward the future to which God is calling this faith community. Speaking of that, at the annual meeting we will elect the Pastor Nominating Committee to seek your next installed pastor!

In the meantime, the Session is working to structure our ministries to be more efficient and effective with more emphasis on ministry and less on meetings. We're also developing a budget that reflects our foundational commitments to mission, worship, and faith formation by shifting resources from administration and operations and lowering those expenses. This will be a transitional year in that process. You'll hear more about it at the annual meeting.

March 1st will be here before long. That is Ash Wednesday and beginning of Lent. We are planning an evening series during Lent to kick off on Ash Wednesday with a light meal and a speaker in addition to worship. Look for more information about that soon.

Also during Lent we will be inviting potential new members to prepare to be received into active membership in the church. We have as many as six young people considering confirmation and a number of adults who will be invited to consider active membership. If you know of potential new members, please encourage them to talk to me and to participate in a new member class to learn more about us and determine if now is the time to commit to active membership. Something to look forward to, we expect to receive new members on Palm Sunday.

I hope you are excited about the church and what the future holds. First Presbyterian has a storied past but God is not done with this congregation. I'm convinced that your best days are still ahead. I give thanks to God for your faith demonstrated in regular acts of loving service and generous giving to Jesus Christ through the ministries of this church.

Sunday School

NURSERY: Our nursery is open from 9 a.m. on Sunday morning through our worship service, for children birth through kindergarten. Children will be escorted upstairs from the nursery to the worship service for the "Kids" Message and then will return to the nursery. In the nursery they may participate in a brief Sunday School lesson and activity. Children are welcome to join their parents for the worship service at any time. **Parents come to the nursery after worship to pick up their children.**

CHILDREN AND YOUTH SUNDAY SCHOOL: The Children and Youth Classes meet in their classrooms directly after the "Kid's Message" in the worship service. The Elementary Class (Kindergarten through Fourth Grade) is studying a series of lessons about "The Life of Jesus". The lessons this semester will focus on the early year's of Jesus's life, his Baptism, his teaching, and choosing his disciples. The class meets in the classroom next to the nursery. The Junior High Class is using *The Good News Bible* for a study of the 66 books of the Bible. The class looks at each book of the Bible and what lessons and stories it teaches. They are keeping a journal of important Bible verses. This class meets in their classroom on the second floor. ALL CHILDREN IN WORSHIP ARE INVITED TO JOIN US FOR THESE CLASSES.

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS: Please join us on Sunday mornings from 9:30 a.m. - 10:00 a.m. in the adult library. We have several chapters left to study from the book "Pray like Jesus" by John R. Brookfield. Each week we will read a chapter on our own time and return on the next Sunday to discuss it. There are books available in the office if you are interested. SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Stated Meeting of the Session January 22, 2017

- 1. Elected Elder Charles Wiles as Treasurer for a second year and elected Elder Nancy Bray, now a non-voting member of the Session, as Clerk.
- 2. Reinstated the Executive Committee of the Session to include the Pastor, Clerk, and Treasurer and 2 Elders elected by the Session. For 2017 the Elders are Mike Brown and Janna Tuck.
- 3. Voted to call a Special Session Meeting after church on Sunday, February 5, to continue working on a balanced budget and restructuring of Session committees.
- 4. Treasurer Wiles announced the Endowment Fund Committee will be able to transfer \$30,348 from investments to our 2017 operating budget.
- 5. Pastor Epling announced a Confirmation Class of about 6 youth is being organized, and in his absence on February 26, Pastor Sam Roethemeyer will preach.
- 6. With Presbytery's provisional approval of our Mission Study, plans were made to include election of a PNC in the Annual Congregational Meeting February 12, 2017 being called by the Session.

Annual Congregational Meeting February 12

The Session has called for the Annual Congregational Meeting to be held following worship on Sunday, February 12, 2017. During the meeting, the 2017 Budget will be presented along with written reports from all the 2016 Session committees. Elders who just completed their term on the Session will be recognized as will some Property Committee members.

In addition, the Nominating Committee will nominate 5 members who are willing, if elected, to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). They include: Sharon McCune, Joanna Shaver, Evelyn Stover, Georganne Syler and Charles Wiles. Information about each of them follows.

SHARON MCCUNE: Sharon has been a member of First Presbyterian Church since 1988. She has served on the Evangelism and Property committees and is currently a member of the Fellowship, Christian Outreach and Nominating committees. For 17 years, she was employed as the church's Office Manager and involved in all aspects of the church's activities and operations. Sharon has been married to Sam McCune for 48 years, and they have two daughters, Kelli and Kristen. Kelli and her husband live in Poplar Bluff and have three children, and Kristen lives in Cape.

JOANNA SHAVER: Joanna has been a lifelong Presbyterian and a member of First Presbyterian since she transferred from her home church in Memphis, TN, nearly nine years ago. She has served as our church's Wedding Coordinator for several years and just completed a term on the Session. As an Elder, she chaired and co-chaired the Worship and Art Committee. Joanna is married to Phil Shaver, and they are parents to seven-year-old Mabry Caroline. An employee of Southeast Missouri State University for 16 years, Joanna is the Coordinator for Campus Programming. Functions she coordinates include the University Speakers Series, the Homecoming Parade, Community Service Program and other student events.

EVELYN STOVER: Evelyn and her husband Bill joined our church March 13, 1966, when Dr. C. E. Mount baptized them and their three sons during the worship service. She has served several times as both a Deacon and an Elder. Evelyn has also been a Sunday School and Vacation Bible School teacher, a Circle Leader and founding member of a Prayer Group for women. Before retiring in 2013, she worked 15 years as Manager of Design Associates and 19 years as Michael Rust's Assistant at Rust and Martin. After retiring, she became her husband's fulltime caregiver until Bill's passing in 2016. Her family with Bill includes three sons and daughters-in-law, two grandsons, a granddaughter-in-law and two great-granddaughters.

GEORGANNE PENZEL SYLER: Georganne is a lifelong member of First Presbyterian Church. She is a graduate of Cape Public Schools and Southeast Missouri State University. She is a Registered Dietitian who received her PhD from Southern Illinois University and is a retired Southeast Missouri State University Professor now actively involved in community service. She and Bill Syler have been married almost 46 years and have two daughters, two sons-in-law and four grandchildren who are two to seven years in age. She has served as a Deacon and Elder and on the Executive/Personnel, Christian Education and Fellowship committees. Presently she is on the Mission and Endowment Fund committees. She chaired the PNC which called Paul Kabo as our pastor. Georganne is proud to say her late Mother was the third woman in our church elected to be an Elder.

CHARLES WILES: Charles is serving as an Elder for the second time and as Treasurer for the second year. He served on the Executive/Personnel Committee two years during his first term on the Session and is on that committee again. He chaired the Communications Committee three years and presently serves on the Finance Committee and the Endowment Fund committees. Charles was on staff at Southeast Missouri State University and retired as a Professor and Administrator after 40 years. During 1993-94, he served as President of Optimist International. While a Board member, Vice President, President-elect and President, he traveled to all 50 states, 8 Canadian Provinces and 14 foreign countries. Charles, the father of two grown daughters and grandfather of five, is married to Judy Wiles, who chairs the University's Marketing and Management Department.

Remember to Turn In Pledge Cards/Per Capita Donations Welcomed

Please remember to turn in your pledge card within the next week if possible. You can drop it in the collection plate this Sunday; mail it in; or call the church office. The Session needs the pledge amount to finalize the 2017 budget for the Annual Meeting on Feb 12.

In addition to your pledge to the church, you are asked to consider donating your per capita assessment. Each year the higher councils of the church divide their administrative expenses among the members of congregations. This is called a *per capita* assessment. Each member chips in a small amount that adds up to enough to support the work of the larger church.

For 2017 our per capita is \$30.51 per member. Most of that stays locally to fund our Presbytery (\$20.50). A small portion goes to fund the Synod (\$2.72) and General Assembly (\$7.29).

Per Capita ensures that the administrative functions of the church continue. For example, this year we will draw heavily on the resources of Presbytery to assist us with the pastoral search. The Synod will continue to produce high quality video resources to assist us with confirmation and new member orientation. The General Assembly is preparing for its gathering in St. Louis in 2018 and will hold the Big Tent Conference in St. Louis this summer.

We encourage you to pay the per capita assessment for yourself and the members of your family. If you are able to contribute more than the \$30.51 per person please do so. It will assist those members who are unable to pay their portion. Mark your check "per capita" and drop it in the offering plate or mail it to the church. There is an envelope for per capita in your box of church envelopes.



Prayer Emphasis in February
