Lent: Seeking the Heart of God in the Heart of the City

It is no accident that our church is located on the corner of Broadway and Lorimier. We've been here a long time. At crucial moments we've considered relocating and decided to stay. We now worship in the third sanctuary built on this site. The prior two buildings were torn down and replaced.





In real estate the standard is "location, location, location." Clearly this church has decided that this is the right location. This is where God wants First Presbyterian Church to be. From this corner the congregation has been a leader in the growth, development, and welfare of the city. Just some highlights:

the first public library was housed in our church beginning in 1908;

the first public schools began here in 1912;

Cape's first Boy Scout Troop (1924) and Girl Scout Troop (1928) were chartered here;

and, Chateau Girardeau Retirement Community was developed by this church in 1979.

In each new era Presbyterians have seen a need in our city and set to work to address it as an extension of our civic-minded faith. This commitment is in our DNA going back to John Calvin who was both pastor of the church in Geneva and mayor of the city. Our faith compels us to serve the community. Of course, our community and its needs have changed over time. It is important for us to remain engaged and to listen for the call of God for this generation. Our Lenten series, *Seeking the Heart of God in the Heart of the City* will help us begin that discernment.

On three evenings in Lent we'll gather for a time of community building with a simple supper provided by our Fellowship Team and brief worship in the sanctuary. Then, we've invited three community leaders to address us about the pressing issues facing our city and region. I hope you'll come and together discern how our church's story is woven into the fabric of the region's future as tightly as it has been in the past.

Many things have changed over the years since our founding in 1835 but one thing has remained the same. Since 1855 our church bell has sounded its bright call from this corner. Every Sunday the bell announces that we are here in the heart of the city. That bell is our call to worship, but its clear tones reverberate like waves over the city. Our worship should also propel us out in service and mission to our city, our region, and the world.



May these 40 days of Lent bring us vision and courage to answer God's call, wherever the Spirit leads us next.

#### **Sunday School**


**NURSERY:** Our nursery is open from 9 a.m. on Sunday morning through our worship service, for children birth through kindergarten. Children will be escorted upstairs from the nursery to the worship service for the "Kids" Message and then will return to the nursery. In the nursery they may participate in a brief Sunday School lesson and activity. Children are welcome to join their parents for the worship service at any time. **Parents come to the nursery after worship to pick up their children.** 

CHILDREN AND YOUTH SUNDAY SCHOOL: The Children and Youth Classes meet in their classrooms directly after the "Kid's Message" in the worship service. The Elementary Class (Kindergarten through Fourth Grade) is studying a series of lessons about "The Life of Jesus". The lessons this semester will focus on the early years of Jesus's life, his Baptism, his teaching, and choosing his disciples. The class meets in the classroom next to the nursery. The Junior High Class is using *The Good News Bible* for a study of the 66 books of the Bible. The class looks at each book of the Bible and what lessons and stories it teaches. They are keeping a journal of important Bible verses. This class meets in their classroom on the second floor. ALL CHILDREN IN WORSHIP ARE INVITED TO JOIN US FOR THESE CLASSES.

#### **SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

#### Stated Meeting of the Session February 21, 2017

- 1. Received information from Pastor Epling and the Executive Committee about 2017 Lenten Series " Seeking the Heart of God in the Heart of this City" and the speakers for March 1,15 and April 13. A class for prospective new youth and adult members will be held during Lent, and the new members will be introduced during worship on Palm Sunday, April 9.
- 2. Approved request from Centenary Methodist Church for a certificate of transfer of Ed Kaiser's membership from our church to Centenary, at his request
- 3. Voted to support Giddings-Lovejoy Presbytery with a donation of \$2.00 per member (144 members at this time) in 2017 and 2018 to assist with PC(USA) General Assembly to be held in St. Louis in 2018.
- 4. Accepted with regret and gratitude for her faithful service the resignation of Barbara Calvin from the Session Class of 2018 and referred the vacancy to the Nominating Committee.
- 5. Approved calling a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, March 19, 2017, to receive the Nominating Committee's report and elect an Elder to fill the unexpired term in the Session Class of 2018.
- 6. Pastor Epling will schedule the first meeting of our church's new Pastor Nominating Committee as early in March as possible to orient them to their duties and begin developing our Ministry Information Form.

Per Capita Donations Welcome Now! Just a reminder that your per capita donation would be appreciated at this time. Each year the higher councils of the church divide their administrative expenses among the members of congregations. This is called a *per capita* assessment. Each member chips in a small amount that adds up to enough to support the work of the larger church.

For 2017 our per capita is \$30.51 per member. Most of that stays locally to fund our Presbytery (\$20.50). A small portion goes to fund the Synod (\$2.72) and General Assembly (\$7.29). Per Capita ensures that the administrative functions of the church continue. For example, this year we will draw heavily on the resources of Presbytery to assist us with the pastoral search. The Synod will continue to produce high quality video resources to assist us with confirmation and new member orientation. The General Assembly is preparing for its gathering in St. Louis in 2018 and will hold the Big Tent Conference in St. Louis this summer.

We encourage you to pay the per capita assessment for yourself and the members of your family. Mark your check "per capita" and drop it in the offering plate or mail it to the church. There is an envelope for per capita in your box of church envelopes.

Thank you again for your contribution which will certainly be used in the fulfillment of our mission.


