LENT BEGINS ON VALENTINE'S DAY!

Sorry Russell Stover, but chocolate might not be the best gift for Valentine's Day this year. You see, it's also Ash Wednesday, the first day of the Lenten season, when many people give up chocolate! Oh, what's a chocolate lover to do?!

On the other hand, Valentine's Day is all about love, and so is Lent. Of course, on Valentine's Day we think about romantic love. It seems to be for couples only. But Lent is all about the **WONDROUS LOVE** of Jesus, shown in his suffering and death for the salvation of the world. In light of his great sacrifice, giving up chocolate seems pretty trivial.



You may have noticed that I use the same charge to close every worship service, based on the two greatest commandments: "Now let us go out into the world to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love our neighbor as ourselves." Everything that Jesus did – especially in the last weeks of his life – was for love of God, neighbor, and self. For that

reason, we will be focusing ourselves through worship, mission, and education, on this **WONDROUS LOVE**.

In worship, I will be doing a sermon series on the last words of Jesus from the cross which are filled with expressions of love for God, others, and himself.

In mission, we will highlight the **One Great Hour of Sharing offering**, which supports hunger programs, self-development of people, and disaster assistance.

AND, for an added BONUS, I will be leading a **Sunday morning study on spiritual practices** (9:30 a.m., beginning February 18, in the PARLOR). The idea behind this is:

- to draw us closer to God, expanding our love for God;
- to increase our spiritual, emotional, and physical health, showing love for ourselves;
- and to give us greater energy and inspiration for serving and loving God's people.

I have nothing against giving up chocolate for Lent. If you can do it, more power to you; I know I don't have enough self-discipline! But I hope you will also consider giving up whatever might get in the way of making time for God. I hope you will love yourself enough to practice self-care. And I hope you will make a commitment to show greater love to family, friends, and strangers.

SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Stated Meeting of the Session January 16, 2018

- 1. Session received the Pastor's Report of Activities for 12-20-17 through 1-15-18, and they included four visits/calls, community service at The People's Shelter, one benevolent assistance, 10 meetings, choir rehearsals and one home Communion service.
- 2. Required annual elections were held, and they included: election of Ruling Elder Nancy Bray as Clerk of Session, election of Ruling Elder Charles Wiles as Treasurer, election of Mike Brown and Joyce Rayfield as Ruling Elders on the Endowment Committee, and election of Sarah Holt and Nancy Bray as Ruling Elders on the Nominating Committee. All of these are one year terms.
- 3. Approved the 2018 Church Budget as presented by Treasurer Wiles. He reported to date that 37 pledges for a total of \$129,000 have been received and only a few more pledges are expected.
- 4. Received report from the Endowment Committee, as presented by Treasurer Wiles, that a total of \$ 91,810.02 is available as a transfer from investments for distribution to the 2018 Church Budget. Last year the amount transferred was \$ 30,348.
- 5. The Session was notified by Presbytery the Per Capita Assessment amount per member in 2018 is \$31.00. These dollars are then divided among the higher councils of the PC (USA) for administrative expenses. With 145 members on our Active Roll, the total our church owes in 2018 will be \$4,495. It was decided, as in the past, an appeal will be made to all members to pay their own Per Capita expense and even pay for someone else's if possible.
- 6. Approved a mission donation of \$ 1,000 to the Community Counseling Center in support of mental health services for children and adolescents and a \$ 500 donation to St. James A.M.E. Church in support of The People's Shelter for homeless community members during the recent extremely cold weather.
- 7. Elder Dave Bengtson, Property Committee Chair, reported on several projects in the works, and they included repairing/improving the wooden Narthex door for aesthetic and security purposes; replacing more church lighting with L.E.D. bulbs for significant cost savings; changing restroom lights/fans to motion-activated switches; and pricing possible heating and cooling changes in parts of the church to improve efficiency of operation (thus cost savings) and comfort, especially in the office area.

The next meeting of the Book Club will be at 7:00 p.m. <u>Tuesday</u>, February 13, 2018 at the home of Sharon Metcalfe. Please note the date change since our normal day would fall on Ash Wednesday. The February book is "The Orphan Mother" by Robert Hicks. The March meeting will be on Wednesday, March 15th at the home of Jean Cairns. The March book is" A Spool of Blue Thread" by Anne Tyler. All are welcome and the reading of the book is optional.

Second Tuesday at the Chateau will meet for lunch and fellowship on Tuesday, February 13, 2018 at 11:00 A.M. in the Chateau Dining Room. Church Safety and Security Training

Our Session at First Presbyterian is committed to providing a welcoming church but also the safest possible place in which to work and worship.

Our Christmas Project for the

Farmington Children's Home was very successful again this year. Besides our wonderful donations from church members we were able to add extra money from our Church Mission Budget to help meet their requests. We were able to purchase a large metal picnic table for the courtyard area used by the lockdown facilities. We also purchased a snow cone machine and a cotton candy machine for them to use for the children's parties. Our budget included money to buy the materials needed to make and serve the snow cones and cotton candy. They were very pleased to no longer have to pay to rent these machines on party days. Our generous donation budget also allowed us to donate \$2000.00 in Walmart gift cards for them to have to use for immediate children's needs. THANKS to everyone who supported our project and who helped to make the lives of the children in Farmington a little brighter.

HELP PAY YOUR PER CAPITA

In addition to your pledge to the church, we encourage you to pay assessment. Each year the higher councils of the church divide their administrative expenses among the members of the congregations. This is called a per capita assessment. Each member chips in a small amount that adds up to enough to support the work of the larger church. For 2018 our per capita is \$31.00 per member.
